Per confronto, nelle grandi università americane ed inglesi, tanto per citare due paesi che sono patrie di celebrate eccellenze accademiche, insegnamenti di Storia della Tecnologia ed anche di Filosofia della Tecnologia sono offerti con successo da molto tempo. Questo libro ha l'ambizione di contribuire a richiamare l'attenzione sull'esigenza di una maggiore cultura e consapevolezza tecnologica. It has been adapted several times over the years, notably by Peter Jackson of Lord of the Rings fame, and more recently in 'Godzilla vs Kong' starring Millie Bobby Brown.
